Upcoming FAASTeam Safety Seminar

Dr. John Kunkaitis, an AME at Olmsted Medical Center will give a briefing on pilot physiological factors followed by an open Q&A session. A 5-year study of drugs found in pilot fatalities showed prescription medications were present in 20% of the pilots, and nonprescription drugs in 16% of the pilots.

Some examples of physiological factors include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter drugs (self medication)
- Hypoxia
- Nutrition
- Stress, worries, External pressures or, Fatigue
- Cold or Flu symptoms
- Sleep deprivation, Circadian rhythm
- Diet, Hydration
- G-loc or G-excess
